Here in Rome late summer has given way to autumn with cooler but endlessly sunny days. The house shutters are open as we welcome the sun into the house once again.

Perhaps this is a metaphor for welcoming into our Congregational 'house' the scenarios that describe what our future *could* look like.

Scenario Building

We were delighted with the increased participation in the Scenario Building Zoom meetings last Saturday. In the first session there were 145 cameras in operation, some of them with two or more Brothers, so there were over 150 Brothers involved. More than 90 were involved in the second session.

It seems to us from our own participation and from feedback since, that there is palpable excitement around the process, as Brothers recognise that all contributions are welcome as we seek to co-create our future.

In one group, a **younger Brother** from the Africa Province shared how proud he is to belong to a Congregation that invites all of us to look together at the dark side of our lives and to contribute to working together for a better future.



Thus for us, Congregation Chapters will be in 2022 and 2028.
