A Reading from the American Bishop's Document on the Evangelization of Youth:

Evangelization is, first of all, the initial effort by the faith community as a whole to proclaim, through word and witness, the Good News of Jesus Christ to those who have not yet heard or seen it, and then to invite those persons into a relationship with Jesus Christ and the community of believers.

Evangelization is also the ongoing witness of the faith community as it attempts to live out the Gospel with such authenticity that the faith of all members is sustained and nourished. As such, evangelization is recognized as the "energizing core" of the life of the Church and all its ministries.
